

User Guidelines

1. Introduction

Title of Legal Notice	Veterinary Medicinal Products and Veterinary Pharmacies (Fees) Regulations, 2024, hereinafter referred to as "the regulations " .
Activity to be regulated	Fees for authorisations of all matters related with the authorisation or registration or notification of veterinary medicinal products, authorisation of wholesale distributors of veterinary medicinal products, issuance of free sale certificates, registration of brokers of veterinary medicinal products, registration for importation and distribution of active substances, licensing of veterinary pharmacies, issuance of a certificate for Good Manufacturing Practice (GMP) , issuance of a Manufacturing Authorisations, inspections related with pharmacovigilance, destruction of veterinary medicinal products or related products including supervision of destruction and assessment of dossiers for the authorisation of veterinary medicinal products.
Responsible entity	The Veterinary Regulation Directorate within the Animal Health and Welfare Department.

2. Objectives and Purpose of the Legislation

The regulations aim to establish the fees payable to the Veterinary Services for services referred to in Regulation (EU) 2019/6, the Veterinary Pharmacy Regulations (S.L. 437.XX) and the Veterinary Medicinal Products Regulations (S.L. 437.XX). The services range from the issuance of authorisation, registration or licences to those related to inspections and supervision. The regulations shall provide legal certainty to stakeholders and increase predictability.

3. Commentary on parts and articles

Regulation 2: Provides a list of definitions.

Regulation 3: Provides that the fees specified in the Schedule shall be payable to the Director of Veterinary Services.

Schedule: Provides the fees and amounts to be paid and validity periods for the registration and authorisation of veterinary medicinal products.
